- 1980, 2000: Vatican pious foundation, INGO


#### Currently

- Programs: Education, MHPSS, Peace & Reconciliation, Livelihoods, Research & Advocacy


## Refugee


- UN Refugee Convention
  - Well-founded fear: individual focus
  - Statelessness: no citizenship
  - Internally displaced person (IDP)

- Catholic Social Teaching
  - Justice
  - Mixed movements: vulnerability
  - Forced displacement: de facto refugees

## **Service (Education)**

- Urban refugees: Bangkok, Indonesia, Malaysia
  - Refugee youth (16-24); pathway to internship program (with private companies through JRS Singapore)
  - Courses in digital and language skills: website and graphic design; English (Jesuit Worldwide Learning certification program)
  - Engagement: teaching or coaching of refugee teachers and/or students (44 students, 4 refugee teachers); understand forced displacement in Somalia, Pakistan, Vietnam, Cambodia; interview refugee staff of JRS; support a refugee student (transport allowance; stipend of a refugee teacher)
- Camp refugees: Thailand-Myanmar border camps
  - 15 schools for primary, middle and high school refugees; 250 refugee teaching and management staff
  - COVID 19: core subjects, competencies; blended home-based and classroom learning
  - Engagement: understand ongoing conflict in Myanmar; interview refugee staff of JRS; support a refugee student (transport allowance; stipend of a refugee teacher)
- IDPs: Myanmar, southern Philippines (Marawi)
  - IDP youth; Muslim and Christian minority; vocational training and social support activities
  - Engagement: understand how youth are lured towards violent extremism; support an IDP youth
